How do I ensure I receive CLE credit for courses taken?

Receiving CLE Credit in New Mexico

The Center for Legal Education is an accredited provider of continuing legal education courses in the state of New Mexico. As required by Supreme Court Rule 18-203(D), the Center files CLE credits directly to New Mexico MCLE within 30 days of a course date. Attorneys cannot self-report CLE credits taken through the Center.

Receiving Live CLE Credit in Texas

The Center for Legal Education is an accredited CLE provider in the state of Texas. Attorneys who are licensed in Texas and wish to receive Texas CLE credit for live Center courses must email cleonline@sbnm.org at least 21 days prior to the course date to request that the Center seek approval for CLE credit in Texas. Please include your Texas Bar Card number, your full name, and the name of the course in your request for Texas credit. Requests received fewer than 21 days prior to the course date may be eligible, provided the requesting attorney pays the mandatory late fee levied by Texas MCLE – typically \$50 per course. As of July 1, 2025, the Center will cover the base course approval fee charged by Texas MCLE, but will no longer cover the mandatory late fee. Texas credit is **not** available for Center on-demand courses.

Receiving CLE Credit in All Other States

Attorneys licensed in a state other than New Mexico or Texas may email <u>cleonline@sbnm.org</u> to request a certificate of completion, since certificates are not routinely available as they are not needed for New Mexico CLE credit.
