Dear Fellow State Bar Members:

I am excited to serve as President of the State Bar of New Mexico in 2019. Last month, I was sworn in by Chief Justice Judith K. Nakamura surrounded by family, friends and colleagues. In Memoriam

George X. Cherpelis born in Milwaukee, Wis., on Aug. 13, 1929, passed away in Scottsdale, Ariz., on Aug. 15, 2018. He is survived by his wife, Carol, their son Nicolas, and his older children from earlier in life, Michael (Pamela) and Lisa (Ray), 10 grandchildren and 12 great grandchildren. Cherpelis was a proud alumnus of the University of Michigan where he studied economics and law. Cherpelis served in the U.S. Air Force as a commissioned intelligence officer during the Korean Conflict. Cherpelis began his legal career as trial attorney for the National Labor Relations Board leaving to serve as labor counsel in the General Motors legal department. Cherpelis also served as chief legal counsel for Burroughs Corporation before entering private practice in Albuquerque. Cherpelis founded the AV-Rated firm of Cherpelis & Salazar in Albuquerque, before moving to Scottsdale, Ariz. in 1996. Cherpelis and his firm were recognized by Martindale-Hubbell as being among the "Preeminent" Labor Law Firms in the country. Cherpelis was admitted to practice in Michigan, New Mexico, New York and Arizona where he was the oldest person to take the Bar Exam. He was admitted to practice before the U.S. Supreme Court and the Sixth, Tenth and D.C. Circuits. Cherpelis practiced before the NLRB for more than 40 years. He volunteered his time on various boards including the City of Albuquerque Personnel Board and Labor Relations Board, as well as the UNM Labor Board. Cherpelis represented management and employers with amazing intelligence, dedication and skill. Cherpelis had a great love for the practice of law and was the consummate "Labor Lawyer." Cherpelis developed a number of young labor lawyers who continued practicing labor law on behalf of management and employers throughout the country in a manner that they hope made him proud. Cherpelis believed that with hard work and dedication anything was possible. His razor wit and tremendous sense of humor brought smiles to the faces of many and his loss left a void in the hearts of all who knew him.

Carlos Ogden, 1935-2017, lawyer, social worker, politician, peace corps volunteer, armored officer, internationalist, big city reformer, Jack Mormon, was a legend. After a tour of duty with the U.S. Army during the longest outbreak of peace the country has ever experienced, Ogden was one of the original peace corps volunteers and was sent to Sergio Leone. After returning home, Ogden was heavily involved in the politics of Southern California in the 1960s where he fought for the rights of the underprivileged and disenfranchised. He attended law school at night, but never bothered to practice law until, children and wife in tow, he relocated to Columbus, N.M. in the '70s. In Columbus, he became mayor, encouraged social responsibility and a sense of community. Among his successes, he brought its people potable water and a library and made it the only American village with a viable foreign policy. This foreign policy included a trans-border mutual aid pact with Palomas, Chih. which allowed the fire departments to cross the border unmolested and let children be educated in both lands. His work as a public defender was marked by a remarkable sensitivity for injustice and an appreciation of cheap gin. He recognized all his fellows as human beings with individual strengths, foibles, and dreams. Some would say he thought outside the box, but those who knew him realized he simply refused to acknowledge the existence of a box. As a lawyer, he stood up for the oppressed and would not knuckle down to those who abuse

authority. Once, he went willingly to jail rather than tolerate illegal raids by la Migra into designated sanctuaries. He was predeceased by his wife Toy Jean Flores Ogden and is survived by his children Anita and Adela Ogden. His sister Nancy Smith and nephew Jeffrey Smith are amongst a host of mourners. He lost count of his grandchildren.

Francisco Mario Ortiz died on Sept. 11, 2018, at age 67. He was a U.S. Marine Corps veteran and studied political science at UNM. He was twice elected ASUNM president and earned the Lena Clauve Outstanding Senior Award. Ortiz graduated from UNM Law School. He began his career at the state and federal Public Defenders Offices in Albuquerque and Las Cruces, practiced criminal defense and family law privately for many years, dedicating his practice to helping underprivileged clients, and recently worked for the State of N.M. Ortiz's colleagues and friends will remember his jokes as well as his compassion and integrity in the courtroom.

THE SUPREME COURT OF NEW MEXICO ANNOUNCES

OUT-OF-CYCLE RULE AMENDMENTS

Under Rule 23-106.1 NMRA, the Supreme Court has adopted out-of-cycle rule amendments. Because of the large number of additional rule amendments approved by the Court on December 20, 2018, the actual text of the rule amendments will not be published in the Bar Bulletin due to space constraints. Instead, what follows is a summary of the new rule amendments that the Court recently approved. Please note that the summary below does not include amendments approved by the Court on November 1 as part of its regular rule-making cycle. The full text of the new rule amendments can be viewed on the New Mexico Compilation Commission's website at http://www.nmcompcomm.us/nmrules/NMRuleSets.aspx.

Public Access to Court Records in Delinquency Proceedings

[Rule 10-166 NMRA]

The Supreme Court has approved an amendment to Rule 10-166(C)(6) NMRA to clarify the provisions governing public access to court records in delinquency proceedings. The amendment replaces previous amendments to the rule and commentary that were approved and then suspended by the Court earlier this year. Proposed amendments to the rule that were subsequently published for comment received a substantial response, and the Court ultimately decided not to adopt the proposed amendments recommended by the committee and has now permanently rescinded the amendments to Rule 10-166 NMRA that were suspended by order of the Court on January 9, 2018. In its latest order, the Court nonetheless recognized that NMSA 1978, Section 32-2-32(A) (2009) requires the confidentiality of certain records and therefore amended Subparagraph (C)(6) of the rule to clarify its scope by deleting the word "court" to make clear that only those records enumerated in Section 32-2-32(A) should be automatically sealed when attached as exhibits to pleadings filed in court without the need for the general sealing of court records in delinquency proceedings. For more information, please see the Court's order rescinding the prior amendments to the rule and approving a limited amendment to Rule 10-166(C)(6). See Order No. 18-8300-021. The amendment takes effect December 31, 2018.

Rules Related to Competency Proceedings and Proceedings Related to Insanity as a Defense

[Rules 5-123, 5-602, 6-302, 6-501, 6-507, 7-302, 7-501, 7-507, 8-302, 8-501, 8-507 NMRA; Form 9-404 NMRA; new Rules 5-602.1, 5-602.2, 5-602.3, 6-507.1, 7-507.1, and 8-507.1 NMRA; and new Forms 9-404A, 9-514, and 9-514A NMRA]

The Supreme Court has approved a recommendation from the Ad hoc Committee on Mental Health Proceedings to amend Rule 5-123 NMRA to more clearly define the court records in a competency proceeding that must be sealed automatically without motion or order of the court, and to amend Rules 5-602, 6-507, 7-507, and 8-507 NMRA, and adopt new Rules 5-602.1, 5-602.2, 5-602.3, 6-507.1, 7-507.1, and 8-507.1 NMRA and new Forms 9-404A, 9-514, and 9-514A NMRA to govern competency proceedings in the district, magistrate, metropolitan, and municipal courts.

Additionally, the Court has approved amendments to Rules 6-302, 6-501, 7-302, 7-501, 8-302, and 8-501 NMRA, and Form 9-404 NMRA, to eliminate the now-invalid plea of "not guilty by reason of insanity" and to clarify that "not guilty by reason of insanity at the time of commission of an offense" may be raised as a defense. The new and amended rules and forms are effective for all cases filed on or after February 1, 2019.

Rules Related to Electronic Filing in Criminal Proceedings

[Rules 5-103.2, LR2-203, and LR12-201 NMRA; and new Rules LR2-309 and LR12-301]

The Supreme Court has adopted new local Rules LR2-309 and LR12-301 NMRA and approved amendments to statewide Rule 5-103.2 NMRA and local Rules LR2-203 and LR12-201 NMRA to authorize electronic filing in criminal proceedings, delinquency proceedings, and all habeas corpus actions. Electronic filing in these types of proceedings will become mandatory in the Second Judicial District Court and Twelfth Judicial District Court beginning on January 14, 2019. The amendments to Rule 5-103.2 permit other judicial districts to propose amendments to their local rules for approval by the Supreme Court as electronic filing in criminal proceedings expands to other areas of the state in the future.

Rules Related to Pretrial Detention and Release

[Rules 5-301, 5-403, 5-409, 6-203, 6-403, 7-203, 7-403, 8-202, and 8-403 NMRA]

The Supreme Court has approved amendments to Rule 5-409 NMRA, which governs pretrial detention proceedings in the district court. Those amendments include a new Subparagraph (B)(3), stating that the court cannot grant or deny a motion for pretrial detention without a hearing. The amendments also include a procedure in Paragraph F for holding a

preliminary examination concurrently with a pretrial detention hearing, revisions to the disclosure provisions set forth in Subparagraph (F)(2), and a new Subparagraph (F)(6) listing factors the court shall consider when making a pretrial detention ruling. The amendments also include revisions to Paragraphs G and H, allowing the court three days to file an order granting or denying a motion for pretrial detention as well as amendments to Paragraph K, addressing successive motions and motions to reconsider. The Supreme Court also approved amendments to the district, magistrate, metropolitan, and municipal court rules that govern probable cause determinations, *see* Rules 5-301, 6-203, 7-203, and 8-202 NMRA, and the revocation of pretrial release, *see* Rules 5-403, 6-403, 7-403, and 8-403 NMRA. The amended rules are effective for all cases pending or filed on or after February 1, 2019.

Rules Related to the Recording of Judicial Proceedings in Magistrate Courts

[Rules 23-107, 2-102, 2-114, 3-102, 6-102, 6-116, and 7-102 NMRA]

The Supreme Court has approved amendments to Rules 23-107, 2-102, 2-114, 6-102, and 6-116 NMRA to authorize the broadcasting, televising, photographing, and recording of proceedings in the magistrate courts subject to the same procedures and conditions that currently govern the appellate, district, and metropolitan courts. The Court also approved amendments to metropolitan court Rules 3-102 and 7-102 NMRA. The amendments take effect December 31, 2018.






